


WHEN GOD CREATED FATHERS

The minute you get near humans, you lose all that. And you are constantly saying 'You are too this, or I'm too this.' That judgment


Use those talents you have. You will make it. You will give joy to the world. Take this tip from nature: The woods would be a very silent place if no birds sang

Since Dallastown's graduation is on June 8th and Thomas graduated from college on May 12th, we offer this little poem by an unidentified writer....




Summer is the perfect time to gaze at the wonders in the sky. Make this craft as a reminder of God's handiwork — including you!
