From the Pastor's Desk



I write this column just days after another shocking event involving our schools and mass killing. We can all agree that this kind of event is happening far too often! And we certainly keep in our hearts and our prayers the families of the seventeen people who died because of the evil choice of one young man to take up a gun and shoot at random. Of course, immediately we hear the call for stricter gun control. But no matter what controls were in place, this young man would have been able to purchase a weapon because he was not on anyone's list. We find out that he had been reported, but the authorities let him slip between the cracks. We heard that in January officials were informed that he posted on social media that he was going to be a mass school shooter.... and nothing was done. I felt from the moment I heard of this event and heard more details about the perpetrator that there must have been something to set him off. We immediately heard he was expelled from school. Was there any follow up with him to explore why and if we could help him work through his issues? We later heard that his mother had died in November — and no one thought this would make him angry enough to do something so drastic? We also found out his father is deceased—now, a nineteen year old is an orphan. And no one tried to talk with him about anger issues?

I certainly agree that the automatic weapons that are so easily attained these days have no place in society. The armed forces may need them to be able to fully defend our nation, but to have them available on our streets is not necessary. But whether it is an automatic rifle or a hand gun, the weapon is not able to kill on its own. Just like an automobile is a necessary item in our society and by itself, it is not able to kill. But when a driver chooses to drive on a sidewalk or a walking path, there will be death. When drivers choose to look at texts on the phone and takes their attention away from the traffic around them, there will be accidents and maybe death. The vehicle does not kill by itself it is the choices the drivers make that can result in death. Likewise, the gun does not get up on it's own and fire at will resulting in death or injury. It is the choice of a human being to take that gun and shoot at people that results in loss of life. So, I feel that if we had better counseling available in our schools. If we had more teachers able and willing to listen to troubled students, if we had more adults who were able to nurture young people who are carrying anger in their hearts and minds, maybe we would be able to diffuse someone before they choose to take a gun and kill.

Since this latest incident, I have seen any number of posts on facebook that emphasize people's opinions about a number of our social issues. These posts range from totally reversing the second amendment and taking away all guns to posts where God is asked why he lets things like this happen in our schools and God's reply is — "I am not allowed in school." Whatever we may think is the answer, one thing is for certain—we need to do something! We need to get back to honoring God—whatever name we give the God we serve. We need to introduce God to many of our nation who never heard of him or were never introduced to a life of faith. We need to PRAY for God to guide us to being the nation our founding fathers had envisioned. Prayer may be a simple answer, but for anyone who is witness to the power of prayer, it is far better than any laws or background checks! LET US PRAY!!!!

MEN'S GROUP









THE CROSS



Can you turn any direction without seeing one? Perched atop a chapel. Carved into a graveyard headstone. Engraved in a ring or suspended on a chain. The cross is the universal symbol of Christianity. An odd choice, don't you think? Strange that a tool of torture would come to

embody a movement of hope. The symbols of other faiths are more upbeat: the six-pointed star of David, the crescent moon of Islam, a lotus blossom for Buddhism. Yet a cross for Christianity? An instrument of execution?

Would you wear a tiny electric chair around your neck? Suspend a gold-plated hangman's noose on the wall? Would you print a picture of a firing squad on a business card? Yet we do so with the cross. Many even make the sign of the cross as they pray. Would we make the sign of, say, a guillotine? Instead of the triangular touch on the forehead and shoulders, how about a karate chop on the palm? Doesn't quite have the same feel, does it?

Why is the cross the symbol of our faith? To find the answer look no farther than the cross itself. Its design couldn't be simpler. One beam horizontal—the other vertical. One reaches out—like God's love. The other reaches up—as does God's holiness. One represents the width of his love; the other reflects the height of his holiness. The cross is the intersection. The cross is where God forgave his children without lowering his standards.

FRUIT LADYBUGS


Get creative in the kitchen with this sweet springtime snack.
