## *From the Pastor's Desk*



## **2020 Church Improvements**

2020 was a remarkably busy year for making improvements within our church despite the COVID-19 issue. Many thanks go out to all our members who contributed either by completing the task or making a financial contribution to aid in the upgrade of our facilities. Thanks to all.

### **Indoors**

1. Installation of a new broader reaching fire/smoke alarm system throughout the church building.
2. CO2 detectors in kitchen area.
3. Began the conversion of fluorescent to LED lighting in the rear entrance hall.
4. Installed new more decorative LED lighting in Nursery and Ladies rest rooms.
5. Refinished windowsills in Gathering Room and installed new curtains.
6. Cleaned seat cushions in sanctuary and carpet throughout church.
7. Installed under cabinet lighting in Pastor's office.

### **Outdoors**

1. Power washed, sealed east wall and windows of Christian Ed. wing.
2. Installed underground piping to channel roof runoff from Christian Ed. Wing.
3. Planted flowering and evergreen bushes along east and north sides of Christian Ed Wing.
4. Mulched beds with multicolored river pebble.
5. Painted column at rear entrance of church.
6. Installed underground drainage pipe at pavilion to prevent mud from washing onto pavilion floor.
7. Installed locking mailbox.

1. Installed drainage pit to receive and control roof runoff on south half of roof.

## **ARTICLE 2: Time For New Rhythms by Chip Gaines**

I'm finding it strange to be talking about rhythm seeing as how, over these past few months, just about every ounce of rhythm that I've ever known has been disrupted.

A global pandemic swept over us, and life as we knew it was thrown completely off-kilter. I know its effects were and will be different for everyone—varying levels of difficulty and devastation. For some, "difficulty and devastation" is an understatement. But, I couldn't imagine us coming out on the other side and not being made stronger because of it, not taking better care of our communities because of it, not realizing what actually matters.

And then my eyes were opened yet again, to the racial injustices that *still* plague our country today. I've spent the past few months listening and trying to sort it all out--- overwhelmed at all the things I don't understand. Overwhelmed by how far we've still got to go. Overwhelmed by how far I've still got to go. I don't have answers. I'm still listening. All I know is this: I must do better. We must do better.

I don't have a quippy punch line or anything cute to say. I don't know what the rhythms of your life looked like before all of this or what they might look like now, but I hope that, as we work to create new ones, we prioritize the things of life that are good and beautiful. Because when everything changes and the world stops and we're forced to look at ourselves, we can't help but take stock of what actually matters, of the bits and pieces of our daily rhythms that are worth fighting for and so many that need to be forgotten. We see the importance of slowing down and taking care of ourselves and of our neighbors and the world around us.

I can't pretend to know how all of this will play out, but I do know this: When a rhythm is disrupted and displaced, another one fills its place. It's how the world works. This time, let's embrace the rhythms of understanding, the rhythms of justice, the rhythms of hope and the rhythms of love.



To make music in the heart.



to all those I meet.


May this simple piece of cloth be

### What you need:

- Crayons

### What you do:


1. Remove labels and break crayons into 1-inch pieces.
2. Scatter pieces on the baking sheet, about two layers thick.
3. Bake for 10 minutes at 350 degrees until melted. Allow to cool 15 minutes.
4. When melted crayons are the consistency of playdough, press the cookie cutter through them (while still on pan).
5. Cool the pan in freezer for 15 minutes until crayons are hardened.
6. Remove from pan and break apart the shapes.
