## *From the Pastor's Desk*



**Greetings to you and peace from God our Father, and our Lord Jesus Christ.**

I definitely hope not, but I will not be surprised if we again get to something like a stay-at-home directive. The fact that the Delta Variant is so rampant is casting a slight shadow on the sessions HUGS are offering in October and November. 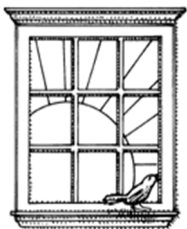

### **Red Brick Church Will Have New Windows Installed**

The decision to replace the windows in the Red Brick Church comes because of evaluation of the windows by the Trustees and the Red Brick church committee. The evaluation found that we need to replace the windows.

The window design is a Low E double-hung window with a grid and insect screens. The cost for the windows and installation is \$16,600. Installation will occur late October or early November.

**OCTOBER 10 - THEN SINGS MY SOUL (Billy Graham music-indoors)**





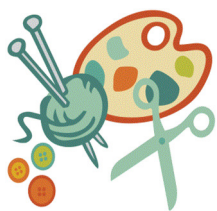
## MEN'S GROUP

May you grow still enough to hear the small noises earth makes in preparing for the long sleep of winter, so that you yourself may grow calm and grounded deep within.

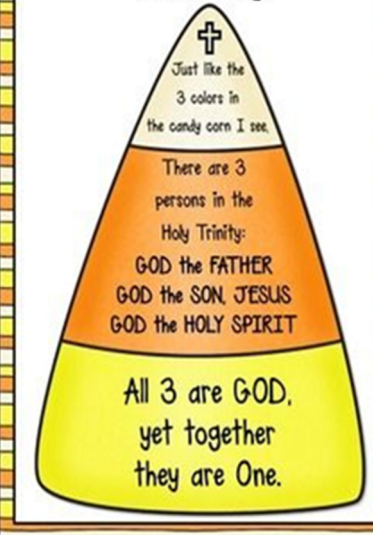
May you grow still enough to hear the trickling of water seeping into the ground, so that your soul may be softened and healed, and guided in its flow.

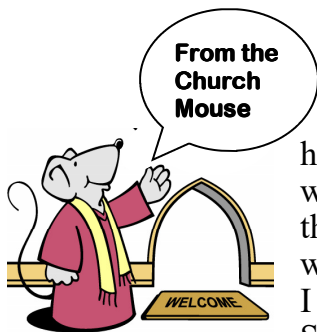
