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From the Pastor's Keyboard



Dear friends in this wonderful family of faith,

One of the most important life verses for me in the Bible (one of my true "north stars") is Galatians 2:20: "I have been crucified with Christ..." One of my most important devotional/spiritual mentors, who lived in the late 19th and early 20th centuries, was a gifted artist, musician, teacher, principal of a Bible college, and a YMCA secretary in Egypt during World War I who was a friend of the troops and known for his uncommon spiritual insight – Oswald Chambers. He died during that war, but his legacy lives on in his own teachings and writings and in writings about him.

One of the things that Oswald Chambers said about the above verse is that there is an inescapable spiritual need each of us has to sign the death certificate, so to speak, of our sin nature. I have found what Chambers says is true: I must take my emotional opinions and intellectual beliefs and be willing to turn them into a moral verdict against the nature of sin; that is, against any claim I have to my right to myself as I surrender my life to Jesus Christ.

The Apostle Paul says in this verse, "I have been crucified with Christ...." He did not say, "I have made a determination to imitate Jesus Christ", or, "I will really make an effort to follow Him." No. But he did say, "I have been *identified* with Jesus Christ in His death." I have experienced, like Oswald Chambers, that once I reach this moral decision and act on it, all that Christ accomplished *for* me on the Cross is accomplished *in* me. What a wonderful thing to remember now that our Lenten (where we followed the journey of Jesus)/Passion/Holy Week/Easter season has just ended!

"...it is no longer I who live...." My individuality remains, but my primary motivation for living and the nature that rules me are radically changed. I have the same human body, but the old satanic right to myself has been destroyed.

The verse goes on, "...and the life which I now live in the flesh," not the life which I long to live or even pray that I live, but the life I now live in my mortal flesh – the life which others can see, "I live by faith in the Son of God..." Oswald Chambers says that this faith was not Paul's own faith in Jesus Christ, but the faith that the Son of God had given to him (Ephesians 2:8). It is no longer a faith in faith, but a faith that transcends all imaginable limits – a faith that comes only from the Son of God.

I have found that the life that we now live by faith will continually be touched by the Holy Spirit. And the Holy Spirit will lead us to abide in Jesus where our "hearts burn within us" (Luke 24:32). If the Holy Spirit restrains us as individuals or as a church, we need to

stop immediately. But if the Holy Spirit kindles a fire within us and stirs and prods us to go forward, we need to let God have God's way in our lives and let the consequences be what they will.

That is true in our individual lives and in our church life. When God puts a spirit of restraint in us, we need to stop. But when God gives us a vision and a stirring, we need to follow up with God at that point, no matter what the cost because that is what God wants for our personal and our congregational lives.

The weeks before and during Lent, I asked you to join me in praying to put God first in our lives, to seek to do what Jesus would do, to join us in online or in- person worship, to pray for world peace and an end to senseless violence, and to do some random act of kindness. During this month of April, following Lent and Easter, I ask you to join me in a prayer to simply ask God to help us discern when He is restraining us and when He is stirring and prodding us to action.

Let us pray as a church to be truly open to how God is leading us as we continue to receive new members, to reach out in helpfulness and prayer to those within our fellowship, to touch lives outside of the four walls of our church, to enjoy our fellowship and fun-raising activities, to lift God in worship, and to continue to grow in our faith lives; in short, let us pray to God to help us to truly be the church.

Will you join me in prayer and in action, as the Spirit directs us, in these exciting times for St. John's Blymire's UCC Church?






The FUN Team is once again sponsoring a ladies luncheon and program. This one is called "All Creatures Great and Small." The event will be held from Noon-

Use scrap paper to fuel new growth and make a gift that keeps on giving.

What you need:


- Scrap paper
- Water
- Herb or flower seeds
- Blender
- Strainer
- Cookie sheet
- Towel
- Adult help

What you do:

- Tear the scrap paper into strips and place in a bowl. Cover the paper with water and let it soak overnight.
- 2. Pour the mixture into a blender and blend about 10 seconds.
- Strain and squeeze the paper pulp to remove excess water. Place in a bowl.
- 4. Sprinkle seeds over the pulp and mix to incorporate them into the pulp.
- Shape the pulp into a flat layer on the cookie sheet. Use a towel to soak up excess water. Allow the paper to dry completely.
- 6. Tear paper into shapes or fold into a card. You can plant the paper directly into soil. Water it and then watch your plants grow!
