Please join Pastor Brenda and Pastor Cindy on THURSDAY mornings at 11:00am as we dive into the scripture being used to preach each week. See you then!





On that same shelf there is a plastic container to collect soda can tabs. These are given to the Ronald McDonald house to use to get funds to help families who stay there.


In the Gathering Room we have a bin to collect used clothing to take to Community Aid. Donations benefit the Dallastown School District's Caring and Sharing Fund.




GIFTS OF WINTER
