From the Pastor's Desk



I want to thank the Coordinating Ministry Team and Blymire's Church for giving me the opportunity to be the "Flavor of the Month" while Pastor Lou Ann was "temporarily resigned" for the month of February. I enjoyed leading worship and working with Wanda for a few weeks, doing some wedding counseling, working with Linda Eichelberger and the confirmation class, and doing some hospital, nursing home, and home visitations. It gave me the opportunity to reconnect with some old friends after two and a half years.

I must admit it was a little strange coming back to preach at Blymire's. First, I had to adjust to the height of the pulpit so I could read my sermon notes. Second, I had to adjust to the lighting so I could see. And third, I had to figure out what all the signals, hand waving and note passing meant from those in the Sound/Video booth!

First, I tried to remind us in my sermons that our task at St. John's Blymire's UCC is to provide LIGHT for a world that often lives in darkness. The light we are to shine is reflected light. It is shone first in Jesus, his disciples, then through us. That is why Jesus said to us, "You are the LIGHT of the world." What an awesome responsibility and privilege. So we have to make sure our lights don't go out, but SHINE!

Second, I tried to remind us through my friend, President Abraham Lincoln, that it is important to deal with our ANGER in a positive way. He wrote a "Hot Letter" by putting all of his anger into a letter, placed it aside until his emotions cooled down, and later wrote on it: "Never sent. Never signed" and filed it away in his desk drawer. So our challenge is to be like Lincoln and show some restraint, because unresolved anger is a spiritual problem. Jesus reminded us that ". . .anyone who is angry will be subject to judgment."

Finally, I tried to remind us the message of the cross seems FOOLISH to some, but to others who are being saved it is the power of God. God started from the bottom up and that is still how God is working today through ordinary folks like you and me. We are God's plan for saving the world and God is counting on us! So are you using your gifts to the glory of God or was God just being FOOLISH in centering His plans in us?

Well, that's it, that's enough from one "Flavor of the Month!" I am looking forward to having Pastor Lou Ann come back in March on a more "Permanent" basis to be our pastor and teacher. Don't forget to give her your love and support just like you have given me over the years.

Toiletries Collection






Easter Project



Make these hands as a helpful prayer guide.




What you need:

THE MEMORIAIN MOUSE


Psst! Let me tell you about my friend. He lives with me here at the Lincoln Memorial in Washington, D.C.

to meet you! Some people run and scream when they see a mouse. I'm glad you are not afraid of me.

I was afraid the night I moved into the Memorial.

I walked between the tall white columns. They looked like they reached the sky! Inside, I saw beautiful murals and words on the walls. What really caught my eye was a giant man made of marble!

Wouldn't that scare you?



The statue sat in a chair. He looked like he was thinking about something very important. His face was kind, but sad. I told him I would be his

friend. Then, I climbed into his huge stone chair for a long nap.

The next morning, many people came to visit the giant. I hid behind him and listened. Most of them seemed to know all about him. Soon, I learned all about him, too.

Have you guessed who my friend is? He is a statue of Abraham Lincoln. The real Abraham Lincoln was the 16th president of the United States of America from 1861 to 1865. The Lincoln Memorial was completed in 1922 to



honor him. Wow! I have an important friend!

It's fun to watch people visit Abe every day. Many children

are excited when they see his face. "Hey! It's the man on the penny!"

I hear them say.

Not everyone is excited when they first see Abe. Once, I felt sorry for a boy and girl who came to the Memorial with their father. Their clothes were ragged and they looked sad.

"I know we don't have much money," the father told his children, "but here sits a man who started out with nothing. He was born in a log cabin with a dirt floor and didn't even get to go to school like you do." I watched the man kneel beside his son and daughter and point to Abe. "Our lives are not easy now, but you can work hard and do something great just like him."

When the children left, they were smiling!

One day, I saw two boys arguing over a balloon as they walked into the Memorial with their mother. "You two stop arguing this minute!" their mother said. When she saw Abe, she stopped walking and her

angry look grew softer. She told her sons how Abe led the country through the Civil War when the North and South were fighting like brothers.

"Abraham Lincoln didn't want the country to split apart. He fought to keep it

together and I'm glad he did." The

mother hugged her boys. "I always want you two to be friends," she said.

I'll never forget one man who visited the Memorial with his grandson. He had white hair and a walking stick. His voice choked with emotion as he told his grandson about Abe. "My great-grandfather was a slave," he said, "but Mr. Lincoln set him free!"

He showed his grandson a mural where chains are falling off the hands and feet of slaves. I saw tears in the man's eyes when his grandson asked, "Grandpa, would we be slaves if Mr. Lincoln hadn't come along?"



Now you know what an important job my stone friend has here at the Lincoln Memorial. Each day, he reminds people of all the good things the real Abraham Lincoln did!
