From the Pastor's Desk



Greetings to you and peace from God our Father, and our Lord Jesus Christ.

As I begin this message, I will admit it is a bit difficult to keep my mind focused on the task. Finally, we are getting some "springlike" weather. By Saturday (March 30) we may have temps in the 70's. Needless to say, many of us are ready for the warmer weather to get here and stay!

I will also admit that I really underestimated the recovery from my neck surgery. Movement for me is going very well. I still have some limitation to moving my head side to side, but as the surgeon said....give it six months or more. I am now three months from surgery, so I am pleased with where my recovery is. But, I initially thought....two weeks recovery and I will be back to normal. — NOT!

As I look to the events that April brings our way, I definitely need to make mention that April 7th (a Sunday this year....and we all know what happens when a birthday is on a Sunday!) Jeri will turn 65. So, HAPPY 65th BIRTHDAY JERI!

Then, of course, April is the month this year that we celebrate Easter! I can never put how meaningful Easter is to me into words. To think that God would come to earth in Jesus so that he could teach us and show us that the "fear of God and God's wrath" is not the God we have is amazing and humbling. God is the God of love and all we need do is reflect on and take to heart John 3:16! To think that God loves me so much that He would come to earth and then suffer as Jesus did and die FOR ME is something so awesome and amazing I get "choked up" and teary-eyed thinking about it! I do not deserve the love that God has for me! But, I humbly say my thanks to God by trying to live my life according to His will for me.

Over the years, I have heard people asking "Why does the date of Easter change every year?" The answer is that in 325 CE, The Council of Nicea determined that on the FIRST SUNDAY following the FIRST FULL MOON after the VERNAL EQUINOX (the arrival of Spring) Easter would be celebrated. Now, I will admit that it seems awkward that this event would change from year to year. We celebrate the birth of Jesus on December 25th and that does not change. We also affirm that there was only one date that could be noted as the day Jesus died on the cross. So why do we not use that particular date as the day for Good Friday and then celebrate the resurrection on the third day? I can simply say that if we did observe Easter this way, then Good Friday could actually fall on any other day of the week and it would not always be on a Friday. Then, Easter could also fall on any day of the week since Jesus' resurrection is the third day and it is on the third

day that Jesus rose from the grave. Also since Maundy Thursday is the day Jesus observed the Passover meal with his disciples, the days we observe as our holy days are closely associated with the Jewish observance of Passover.

I remember celebrating Easter some years had been a bit challenging since certain years the observance of Easter fell on the same day that we "Sprung ahead" with the clocks. We not only had to get up early to share in the Easter Dawn Service, but some years we also lost an hour of sleep. Needless to say, most of those Easter days I would take a nap before even thinking about Easter dinner.

I hope that this year as we celebrate Easter that we all have a deeper appreciation for what God did for us in our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ!



EASTER PARTY


Our annual church Easter Party and Egg Hunt will be held on Sunday, April 14, at 10:30 AM. There will be no Sunday School that morning. We



"FATHER, FORGIVE THEM" The dialogue that Friday morning was bitter. From the onlookers, "Come down from the cross if you are the Son of God!" From the religious leaders, "He saved others but he can't save himself." From the soldiers, "If you are the king of the Jews, save yourself."

Bitter words. Acidic with sarcasm. Hateful. Irreverent. Wasn't it enough that he was being crucified? Wasn't it enough that he was being shamed as a criminal? Were the nails insufficient? Was the crown of thorns too soft? Had the flogging been too short? For some, apparently so...

Of all the scenes around the cross, this one angers me the most. What kind of people, I ask myself, would mock a dying man? Who would be so base as to pour the salt of scorn upon open wounds? How low and perverted to sneer at one who is laced with pain. The words thrown that day were meant to wound. And there is nothing more painful than words meant to hurt...

If you have suffered or are suffering because of someone else's words, you'll be glad to know that there is a balm for this laceration. Meditate on these words from 1 Peter 2:23 (NIV): "When they hurled their insults at him, he did not retaliate; when he suffered, he made no threats. Instead, he entrusted himself to him who judges justly."

Did you see what Jesus did not do? He did not retaliate. He did not bite back. He did not say, "I'll get you!" "Come on up here and say that to my face!" "Just wait until after the resurrection, buddy!" No, these statements were not found on Christ's lips.

Did you see what Jesus did do? He "entrusted himself to him who judges justly." Or said more simply, he left the judging to God. He did not take on the task of seeking revenge. He demanded no apology. He hired no bounty hunters and sent out no posse. He, to the astounding contrary, spoke on their defense. "Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing."? (Luke 23:34 NIV)...

And when you think about it, they didn't. They hadn't the faintest idea what they were doing. They were a stir-crazy mob, mad at something they couldn't see so they took it out on, of all people, God. But they didn't know what they were doing.

Yes, the dialogue that Friday morning was bitter. The verbal stones were meant to sting. How Jesus, with a body wracked with pain, eyes blinded by his own blood, and lungs yearning for air, could speak on behalf of some heartless thugs is beyond my comprehension. Never, never have I seen such love. If ever a person deserved a shot at revenge, Jesus did. But he didn't take it. Instead he died for them. How could he do it? I don't know. But I do know that all of a sudden my wounds seem very painless. My grudges and hard feelings are suddenly childish. Sometimes I wonder if we don't see Christ's love as much in the people he tolerated as in the pain he endured.


Remember God's special gift of Jesus by making this craft.

What you need:

- Large piece of blue paper
- Large bowl
- Pencil
- Scissors
- Paint (green and red)
- Paintbrush
- Wet wipes
- 3 wooden craft stick
- Craft glue
- Black marker
- Bible

What you do:

- On the paper, trace around the bowl. Cut out the circle.
- Paint your palms green, one at a time, and press them in the circle side by side. (Clean your hands with wet wipes.)
- Dip a finger in red paint and make a dot on the center of each handprint.
