From the Pastor's Desk



Greetings to you and peace from God our Father, and our Lord Jesus Christ.

HAPPY NEW YEAR!!!! Question....how are we doing with being CHRISTTER People? 

Trustees Report-Projects completed in 2019

We had a very active year with repairs and improvements to our buildings and grounds.

Church building:

Replaced the roof over the foyer entrance with new rubber roofing, insulation board and flashing. Rubber mats were installed to protect the roof material when entering the roof for repairs to bell tower or roof.

Installed security cam for viewing of anyone wishing to enter the building by our administration staff.

Cleaned and painted wrought iron railings at parking lot entrance and staircase at education wing. Ran power from the Red Brick Church to our church sign.

Replaced basketball post. Made repairs to potholes in driveway.

Had power company repair dusk to dawn light to illuminate our driveway entrance and help with security at the Red Brick Church.

Picnic Pavilion:

Formed and poured a concrete base for the chicken BBQ pit. Installed gutter guard on pavilion to prevent leaves and tree branches from clogging our drainage system.

Red Brick Church:

Improved drainage by: 1. Clearing debris from drainpipe. 2. Contouring drainage swale to move water away from the building thus preventing water from entering the basement.

Most all of the projects were completed by our members volunteering their time and many times materials. If not for this volunteering of time and donated materials, many of the improvements would not have been possible. Our annual church budget is not strong enough to support hiring of contractors to do the many projects that were completed this year. The Trustees want to thank all those who helped with this large project list.


A little girl asked her mother,

"STEP" INTO THE NEW YEAR


Make this craft to remember God's many blessings.

What you need:

- Small stones
- Permanent markers
- Foil pan and cooking spray
- Drop cloth
- Gloves
- Quick-set concrete (and adult help)
- · Bucket and paint stirrer

What you do:

- After reflecting on the past year, use markers to decorate stones with memorable words, dates and drawings.
- Spray pan with cooking spray. Set pan outside on a drop cloth.
- Wearing gloves, mix concrete in a bucket, according to instructions.
- Pour concrete into pan. Smooth top with paint stirrer.
- Press in stones, handprints and other decorations.
- Let dry completely. Remove from pan.
- Place the stepping-stone outside as a reminder of God's continued goodness.
