From the Pastor's Desk



Greetings to you and peace from God our Father, and our Lord Jesus Christ.

OH MY GOODNESS!!! Last month the Pastor's Desk column focused on COVID 19 and how we need to look beyond self and help those around us who may be in a difficult spot. I kept the last paragraph from April's column and share it here:

"Our hope is that the divine in each one of us will overpower the human side throughout this pandemic and we will put others first and do all that we can to help others make it through! We need to put self in our back pockets and share in taking care of others who may be more impacted than we are. Let us SERVE as God needs us to serve..... especially now!"

Little did I imagine just what this past month would entail! We are asked to stay at home which means the only time we should be out on the road is to get groceries, pick up prescriptions, etc. Many are not able to go to work every day because their business, be it production or merchandise selling, is closed down. Only "essential" companies and businesses are allowed to operate day to day. A number of people are now able to work at home, and this may be something that they will do long term....even after the threat of COVID 19 is under control.

We are not allowed to gather for worship because of the stay at home order and that we are asked to limit groups to 10 or less. I definitely miss seeing all of my faith family gathered for worship! I miss the hugs! (I bet most of you would have guessed that would be one of the first things I mention!) I miss the atmosphere of the fabulous music that is always a part of our worship experience... from Brenda's special music to the choir anthem to the hymns.... I LOVE IT and miss it!!!

I will share with you here that I do intend to offer an OUTDOOR gathering for worship beginning Sunday May 3, at 10:00 AM. I ask you to remain in your cars and park facing the pavilion. I have ordered an FM transmitter which will allow you to hear the worship service on your car radio. BUT, if that does not arrive before May 3, I will use my sound system to project the service. If that is the case, you will have to put down your car windows which brings up a bit of caution for some people, but, nonetheless.... we will have worship for all who choose to come to the church. If you prefer to not come for in-car worship, that is perfectly fine!!!!! There will be worship outlines that will be distributed and we will have someone collect the offering envelopes BUT... those who collect the envelopes and distribute the order of worship WILL BE WEARING GLOVES AND MASKS!!! We will do all that we can to abide by the guidelines of safety!!!

One thing we will share also is that for the time being, once we are able to gather in the Sanctuary for worship, we will refrain from having a Greeter hand you the bulletins...they will be on a table for you to pick up. We will verbally greet everyone, but we will try to not touch items that you will need to pick up. We also may change the collection of offering so that individuals touching the plates, etc. will be kept at a minimum. We will be looking at different variables that we may need to address in order to maintain a SAFE environment in our church. We will be installing Hand Sanitizer dispensers at both entrances to the church and we will be placing a stand dispenser in the Gathering Room for your use. We at S.J.B. will do all that we can to ensure the health and well being of our Faith Family and Friends!!!

St. John's Blymire's U.C.C. Shirt Fund Raiser

We have not had a shirt Fund raiser project for a number of years. We had an offer of support for this project that will ensure a good profit for our church funds. The emblem is embroidered on the shirts, not screen printed.

Orders are due back to us by June 30.

We will offer White (as in the picture) and Light Blue colors in all sizes listed.

The sizes we offer are: Men's: S, M, L, XL, 2XL, 3XL, 4XL.

Tall Men's: ST, MT, LT, XLT, 2XLT, 3XLT, 4XLT. Ladies: AS, AM, AL, AXL, A2XL, A3XL, A4XL.

Youth sizes: YS, YM, YL, YXL.

PRICES: \$25.00 per shirt for S, M, L, or XL sizes (Two for \$45.00) (Three for \$65.00) (Four for \$80.00) and can be in a combination of colors and sizes. There is a surcharge per shirt for the larger sizes! For a 2XL SHIRT, you would add \$2.00 per shirt; 3XL you would add \$4.00 per shirt; and for 4XL you would add \$5.00 per shirt.

Note: If you order three shirts.... One Men's 3XL, one ladies AXL and one Youth L, the price would be \$65.00 + \$4.00 for the surcharge on the Men's shirt. If you order Two Tall Men's 2XLT and one Ladies' L, the cost would be \$65.00 + \$8.00 for the surcharge on 2 of the Tall Men's size.



MEMORIAL DAY and THE NATIONAL MOMENT OF REMEMBRANCE

Memorial Day weekend is when America pretends that summer has started. And if you're like 80% of us, that's where the meaning of the three-day holiday begins and ends. Which is why, in 2000, Congress passed The National Moment of Remembrance Act, as an added way of honoring America's fallen heroes. The Act asks Americans, wherever they are at 3 pm local time on Memorial Day, to pause for a duration of one minute to remember those who have died in military service to our



country. The time of 3pm was chosen because it's likely when Americans are off work and most enjoying the freedoms made possible by those who died in service of their country.

Memorial Day was originally established as Decoration Day in 1868, as a way to honor the fallen soldiers of the Civil War. Never before had so many American soldiers died in battle, and as a result, national cemeteries began to be formed. On the first Decoration Day, 5,000 participants gathered at Arlington National Cemetery to decorate the graves of the 20,000 Union and Confederate soldiers buried there. Southern states refused to acknowledge the day, choosing to honor their dead on separate days until after World War 1, when Memorial Day changed from honoring those who died during the Civil War to those fallen in any war.

But as the true meaning of Memorial Day has become obscured over time, shrouded in the haze of BBQ smoke, some were moved to institute a moment of silence. Allegedly, the idea for the moment came when children touring Washington were asked about the meaning of Memorial Day and responded, "That's the day the pool opens."

So the National Moment of Remembrance Act calls us to stop and remember. Because of the current pandemic, the observance will not be the same this year. Normally, at 3pm on Memorial Day Monday, in observance of the National Moment of Remembrance: Trains blow their whistles, major league baseball games pause for a moment of silence, cars drive with their headlights on, Americans everywhere wave flags, and "Taps" play throughout the nation.

Although celebrations may look very different in 2020, please remember to observe the National Moment of Remembrance with your family. It's important that we impart the true meaning of this holiday to our children so that they grow up understanding that Memorial Day is not about our own pleasure but about honoring those who made the ultimate sacrifice.





Make this cute puppet to show and tell the amazing story of metamorphosis.




What you need:
