



I didn't want her to go home empty handed. I poked around the pantry. At the back of a drawer, I found an envelope. Inside was a grocery gift card. "Melanie, you'll be having Christmas dinner!" I said.

Inspired I checked every single cupboard. All empty, except the very last one, which held a mystery box with a bow.
Inside was a red dress, just Melanie's size.

"It's perfect!" she said holding the dress up to herself. That's when something fell out of it. A store gift card for just enough to buy a gift for each one of her children.

Not long after Christmas, Melanie was interviewed for a job and was hired. No surprise to me, she was wearing her new red dress!




TOO BUSY


